NOTIFICATION

No. DTP/MUN-SCHEME-06/2019-20.—Whereas, the draft of the Arunachal Pradesh Plastic Waste Management Bye-laws was published under the Notification of Government of Arunachal Pradesh, Department of Town Planning and Urban Local Bodies vide Notification No. DTP/MUN-Scheme-06/2019-2020 dated 15th October, 2019 in the Arunachal Pradesh EOG No. 398. Vol - XXVI dated 21st October, 2019 of the said date inviting objections or suggestions from the persons likely to be affected thereby before the expiry of the period of one month from the publication of the said notification;

And whereas the copies of the said Gazette were made available to the public on 21st October, 2019;

And whereas, no objections were received except the suggestions of the Arunachal Pradesh Pollution Control Board which were duly considered by the State Government;

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Section 448 of the Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 2007, sub-sections of the Section 410(b) (e) read with Section 412 of the Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 2019 and in accordance with Sub-Rule (4) of Rule 6 of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018, the Government of Arunachal Pradesh hereby makes the following rules for management of plastic waste, namely-

- 1. Short title and commencement: (1) These Bye-laws shall be called the "Arunachal Pradesh Plastic Waste Management Bye-Laws, 2023".
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- Application: (1) These Bye-laws shall be applicable within the territorial limits of Municipal Council/ Municipal Corporation/Nagar Panchayat/District Urban Development Agency (DUDA) and other notified towns of the State of Arunachal Pradesh.
 - (2) They shall be applicable to every public, to every generator of plastic waste and to every premise under the ownership or occupation of any person within the limits of the Municipal Council/Municipal Corporation/Nagar Panchayat/DUDA and other notified towns of the Arunachal Pradesh.
- 3. Definitions: In these Bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, capitalized words shall have the following meaning:
 - (a) "Act" means the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986)/ Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Act 2007/ Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 2019 (Act, No. 8 of 2019).
 - (b) "APSPCB" means Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board.
 - (c) "Authorization" means the permission given by the State Pollution Control Board or Pollution Control Committee, as the case may be, to the operator of a facility or urban local authority, or any other agency responsible for processing and disposal of solid waste;
 - (d) "Brand owner" means a person or company who sells any commodity under a registered brand label
 - (e) "Bye-laws" shall mean these Arunachal Pradesh Plastic Waste Management Bye-laws, 2022 as amended from time to time;
 - (f) "Carry bags" mean bags made from plastic material or compostable plastic material, used for the purpose of carrying or dispensing commodities which have a self-carrying feature but do not include bags that constitute or form an integral part of the packaging in which goods are sealed prior to use.

- (g) "CMEO" means the Chief Municipal Executive Officer of the Municipal Council appointed by the State Government:
- (h) "Commodity" means tangible item that may be bought or sold and includes all marketable goods
- "Competent Authority" means the Municipal Commissioner/Chief Municipal Executive Officer in Municipality and Deputy Commissioner cum Chairman DUDA in the notified DUDA towns;
- (j) "Consent" means the consent to establish and operate from the concern Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Board or Pollution control committee granted under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (6 of 1974) and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 (14 of 1981);
- (k) "Co-processing" means use of non bio-degradable and non-recyclable solid waste giving calorific value exceeding 1500 Kcal as raw material or as a source of energy or both to replace or supplement the natural mineral resources and fossil fuels in industrial process;
- (I) "Deputy Commissioner" means the Deputy Commissioner of the District appointed by the State Government.
- (m) "Disintegration" means the physical breakdown of a material into very small fragments;
- (n) "DUDA" means District Urban Development Agency; a society registered under Society Registration Act 1860 under Department of Urban Development, Government of Arunachal Pradesh.
- (o) "Extended producer's responsibility" means the responsibility of a producer for the environmentally sound management of the product until the end of its life;
- (p) "Facility" means the premises used for collection, Storage, recycling, processing and disposal of plastic waste;
- (q) "Food-stuffs" mean ready to eat food products, fast food, processed or cooked food in liquid, powder, solid or semi-solid form;
- (r) "Fine" means penalty imposed on waste generators or operators of waste processing and disposal facilities under the Bye-laws for non-compliance of the directions contained in these rules and/or Bye- laws,
- (s) "Importer" means a person who imports and holds as Importer-Exporter Code Number, unless otherwise specifically exempted.
- (t) "Institutional waste generator" means and includes occupier of the institutional buildings such as building occupied by Central Government Departments, State Government Departments, public or private sector companies, hospitals, schools, colleges, universities or other places of education, organization, academy, hotels, restaurants, malls and complexes;
- (u) "Local body" means Urban Local Body with different nomenclatures such as Municipal Council, Municipal Corporation, Nagar Panchayat, District Urban Development Agency, and Urban Towns notified by Government of Arunachal Pradesh from time to time.
- (v) "Manufacturer" means and includes a person or unit or agency engaged in production of plastic raw material to be used as raw material by the producer.
- (w) "MEO" means Municipal Executive Officer appointed by the State Government.
- (x) "Multilayered packaging" means any material used or to be used for packaging and having at least one layer of plastic as the main ingredients in combination with one or more layers of materials such as paper, paper board, polymeric materials, metalized layers or aluminum foil, either in the form of laminate or co-extruded structure.
- (y) "Municipal Commissioner" means the Municipal Commissioner of the Municipal Corporation appointed by the State Government.
- (z) "Plastic" means material which contains as an essential ingredient a high polymer such as polyethylene terephthalate, high density polyethylene, Viny1, Low density polyethylene, Polypropylene, polystyrene resins, multi-materials like acrylonitrile butadiene styrene, polyphentlene oxide, polycarbonate, polybutylene terephthalate;
- (aa) "Plastic sheet" means plastic sheet is the sheet made of plastic.
- (bb) "Plastic waste" means any plastic discarded after use or after their intended use is over.
- (cc) "Producer" means person engaged in manufacturing of import of carry bags or multilayered packaging or plastic sheet or like, and includes industries or individuals using plastic sheets or like or cover made of plastic sheet or multilayered packaging for packing or wrapping the commodity;
- (dd) "Processing" means any scientific process by which plastic waste is treated for processing for the purpose of reuse, recycling or transformation into new products or making it suitable for land filling;
- (ee) "Recycling" means the process of transforming segregated plastic waste into a new product or raw material for producing new products.

- (ff) "Recyclable Waste" means waste that can be transformed through a process into raw materials for producing new products, which may or may not be similar to the original products;
- (gg) "Rules" means the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018;
- (hh) "Segregation" means sorting and separate storage of various components of solid waste namely biodegradable waste including agriculture and dairy waste, non biodegradable waste including recyclable waste, non-recyclable combustible waste, sanitary waste and non-recyclable inerts waste, domestic hazardous wastes and construction and demolition wastes.
- (ii) "User charge" means a fee imposed by the Local Body on the waste generator to cover full or part cost of providing plastic Waste collection, transportation, and processing and disposal services in accordance with these Bye-laws;
- (jj) "Virgin plastic" means plastic material which has not been subjected to use earlier and has also not been blended with scrap or waste;
- (kk) "Waste management" means the collection, storage, transportation reduction, re-use, recovery, recycling, composting or disposal of plastic waste in an environmentally safe manner;
- (II) "Waste pickers" mean individual or agencies groups of individuals voluntarily engaged or authorized for picking of recyclable plastic waste.
- (mm)"Waste Generator" means and includes any person or group of persons, buildings occupied by the central Government departments or undertakings, State Government departments or undertakings, local bodies, public sector undertakings or private companies, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, colleges, universities, other educational institutions, hostels, hotels, restaurants, shops and commercial establishments, markets, places of worship, stadiums and spots stations, airports and other transportation hubs, residential, apartment and housing complexes, Resident Welfare Associations and Market Associations, gated communities, corporate campus, technology parks and institutions, Indian Railways and defence establishments, which generate Solid Waste;

The words and expressions used but not defined in the Bye-laws shall have the same meaning as respectively assigned to them in the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.

4. Compliance with Plastic Waste Management Rules:

- (a) No person shall manufacture, stock, distribute, sell or use plastic carry bags, plastic sheet, cover made of plastic sheet or multi-layered packaging or any other plastic product in violation of the provisions of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, as amended in 2018.
- (b) Carry bags made of virgin or recycled plastic shall not be less than seventy-five microns (75μ) in thickness with effect from 30th September, 2021 and one hundred twenty (120μ) in thickness from 31st December, 2022.
- (c) Use of plastic carry bags or plastic products that do not conform to the specifications of the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018, shall be prohibited.

5. Segregation, Collection and Storage of Plastic Waste:

- (a) Every waste generator shall segregate the waste generated by them at the source at which such wastes are generated. The plastic wastes shall be stored separately from other kinds of wastes within the premises of the waste generator. This responsibility shall fall upon the occupier or manager of the premises of the waste generator as the case may be. The aforementioned entities shall hand over such segregated plastic waste to the collection agency designated by the Local body or any other authority notified by Government.
- (b) Plastic packaging of food wastes shall be emptied of their food content before being segregated. Further non-plastic biodegradable waste (including food waste) shall not be disposed of in plastic bags other than plastic garbage bags manufactured specifically for the disposal of biodegradable waste. No plastic waste shall be disposed otherwise as provided under these Bye-laws. Further, no plastic waste shall be burnt in any public or private premise.
- (c) No plastic, including plastic containing any liquid which by reasons of its mass or other characteristics is likely to render any collection unreasonably difficult for the Urban Local Body's employees or service provider to handle, shall be stored or placed along with other plastic wastes.
- (d) Bulk generators of solid waste such as Cinema Halls, Hotels, Institutions, Shopping Hall, Hospitals, Hostels, and Schools shall be encouraged to initiate and undertake special drives and programs to promote segregated waste collection. This could be in the form of one-day collection drives, Community waste collection Centers.

6. Collection Centers and Transportation:

- (a) The Local Body or any other authority notified by Government shall set up designated community waste collection centers in the city. These will be operated by designated waste management organizations/ waste pickers organizations/and/or recyclers.
- (b) Plastic wastes shall, upon segregation, be handed over to waste pickers designated to collect plastic wastes from the doorstep of the particular waste generator. However, where door to door waste collection services is not available and/or a waste generator does not avail of the waste collection services of waste pickers, such waste generator shall dispose of the segregated plastic waste at the Community Waste Collection Centers, designated by the Local Body.

7. Processing of Plastic Waste:

- (a) The Local Body shall set up treatment and processing facilities as per the requirement of quality of plastic to be processed in line with the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018
- (b) The Local Body may, for the purpose of recycling, treating, processing and disposing of plastic wastes or converting such wastes into any other matter, construct, acquire, operate, maintain and manage any establishment within or outside the Urban Local Body area/Urban limit and run it on a commercial basis or may contract out such activity.
- (c) The Local Body shall encourage the recycling of plastic wastes.
- (d) The Local Body shall encourage the adoption of suitable processing technologies such as plastic road construction, plyrolysis, co-incineration, co-processing, waste to energy and brick & tiles etc., to reduce the disposal of plastic wastes into landfills.
- (e) The waste processing and disposal site shall be designed, constructed and maintained as per the CPCB guidelines.
- (f) Only the inert plastic waste shall be disposed of in the landfill.

8. Waste Management Charges:

- (a) The waste generators, retailers and producers shall be liable for all charges incurred towards plastic waste management in the city as prescribed in the Bye-law-10.
- (b) Every person responsible for organizing an event in open space shall be liable to pay waste management charges as notified by the local authority from time to time.
- (c) The Local Body shall utilize the user charges, registration fees and penalties collected from waste generators for solid waste management exclusively.

9. Plastic Waste Management System:

The Local Body shall establish, operate, administer and co-ordinate a Plastic Waste Management System (PWMS). The key goals of the Plastic Waste Management System are:

- (a) To ensure the safe collection, storage, segregation, transportation, processing and disposal of plastic waste within its jurisdictional limits as may be mandatory for the Local Body in accordance with the Plastic Waste Management 2016, as amended in 2018;
- (b) To set up plastic waste collection centre's/ material recovery facilities for plastic waste;
- (c) To ensure its channelizing to recyclers including through the existing formal/ informal waste recycling sector :
- (d) To create awareness among all the stakeholders about their responsibilities;
- (e) To ensure the financial sustainability of plastic waste management.
- (f) To implement Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) and levy user charges, penalty etc. for effective implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018.

9.1 Waste generators:

- (a) Individual household and institutional waste generator shall take steps to minimize generation of plastic waste and segregate plastic waste at source.
- (b) The waste generators will segregate the plastic waste at source and store it separately.
- (c) All institutional generators of plastic waste shall segregate and store the waste generated by them in accordance with the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018 and handover segregated wastes to authorized waste processing or disposal facilities or deposition centers either on its own or through the authorized waste collection agency.
- (d) The waste generators shall not litter or burn the plastic waste. No waste generator shall dispose the plastic waste to drains and any unauthorized place within municipal or urban area.
- (e) The waste generators shall be liable to pay plastic waste management user fees as stipulated by Local Body from time to time.
- (f) Every person responsible for organizing an event in open space, which involves service of food stuff in plastic or multilayered packaging shall segregate and manage the waste generated during such events.

9.2 Organized wholesaler, retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors :

- (a) No person shall sell or provide commodities to consumers in plastics carry bags, plastic sheet or multi-layered packaging which is manufactured, labeled or marked in contravention of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (b) No plastic carry bags shall be made available free of cost by organized retailers, un-organized retailers, vendors, hawkers etc. to any consumers.

- (c) The organized wholesaler willing to provide plastic carry bags to retailers, street vendors and hawkers shall register with the Local Body or Deputy Commissioner of concern district and pay registration charges as stipulated in the Bye-law-10. Only the registered organized wholesaler can provide plastic carry bags that conform to the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (d) The organized retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors willing to provide plastic carry bags for dispensing any commodity shall register with the Local Body or Deputy Commissioner of concern district and pay a waste management charges as stipulated in the Bye-law-10. Only the registered organized retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors can provide plastic carry bags that conform to the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (e) The organized retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors shall display at prominent place that plastic carry bags are available on payment and restrictions are imposed pursuant to these Bye-laws.
- (f) The organized retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors who register with the Local Body or Deputy Commissioner of concern district but do not wish to provide plastic carry bags to the customers, shall sign a declaration as given in Form - 4 in Annexure - 2, and shall not be liable to pay user/renewal charge as stipulated in the Bye-law-10.
- (g) Unregistered organized and un-organized retailers and street vendors found guilty of using plastic carry bags shall be penalized as per provision contained under these Bye-laws and by Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (h) Every organized and un-organized retailer or street vendors selling or providing commodities in plastic carry bags or multi-layered packaging or plastic sheets or like or covers made of plastic sheets which are not manufactured or labeled or marked in accordance with Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018 shall be liable to pay such fines and penalties as specified in Annexure-I.
- Street vendors using plastic products to serve their goods shall ensure that the waste is collected, segregated and handed over to designated waste collection agency.

9.3 Producers and Brand Owners:

- (a) Producers and brand owner shall adhere to Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018 and other regulations in conformance with the APSPCB. The primary responsibility for setting up collection systems-for plastic waste lies with producers and brand owners; the Local Body will seek the assistance of producer and brand owner for providing financial support towards development of plastic waste management system within the jurisdiction of the urban limit or Municipal limit.
- (b) The Local Body shall work out the modalities of a mechanism based on Extended Producer Responsibilities involving producers and brand owner.
- (c) Primary responsibility for collection of used multi-layered plastic sachet or pouches or packaging is of Producers, Importers and Brand Owners who introduce the products in the market. They need to establish a system for collecting back the plastic waste generated due to their products. This plan of collection to be submitted to the APSPCB while applying for registration to Establish or Operate or Renewal. The Brand Owners whose registration has been renewed before the notification of these rules shall submit such plan within one year from the date of notification of these Bye-laws and implement within two years thereafter.
- (d) Producers and retailers shall take definitive steps to substitute plastic packaging to other biodegradable and recyclable material to the extent possible as per the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, as amended in 2018.

9.4 Recyclers and Operators of Plastic Treatment Plants:

- (a) The recyclers and operators shall adhere to Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018, and other regulations in conformance with the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board.
- (b) Recycling of plastic shall be carried out in accordance with the Indian Standard: IS 14534:1998 titled as Guidelines for recycling of Plastic, as amended from time to time;
- (c) The recyclers shall ensure that recycling facilities are in accordance with the Indian Standard: IS 14534: 1998 titled as Guidelines for Recycling of Plastic and in compliance with the rules under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 as amended from time to time;
- (d) The recyclers shall work with the Local Body or urban limit to ensure that the residue generated from recycling process is disposed of in accordance with the relevant schedules under the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.

9.5 Registration of Producer, Brand Owners, Manufacturer and Recyclers :

(a) No person shall manufacture carry bags or recycle plastic bags or multilayered packaging unless the person has obtained a registration from the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board, prior to the commencement of production;

- (b) Every person recycling or processing waste or proposing to recycle or process plastic waste shall make an application to the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board, for grant of registration or renewal of registration for the recycling unit, in Form - II of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (c) Every manufacturer engaged in manufacture of plastic to be used as raw material by the producer shall make an application to the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board, for the grant of registration or for the renewal of registration, in Form - III of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended in 2018.
- (d) The Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board shall not issue or renew registration to plastic waste recycling or processing units unless the unit possesses a valid consent under the Water (Prevention and control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (6 of 1974) and Air (Prevention and control of Pollution) Act, 1981 (14 of 1981) along with a certificate of registration issued by the District Industries Centre or any other Government agency authorized in this regard.
- (e) Every producer or brand-owner shall for the purpose of registration or renewal of registration, make an Application in Form - I of the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018 to-
 - The State Pollution Control Board or Pollution Control Committee, if operating in one or two States or Union Territories; or
 - (ii) The Central Pollution Control Board, if operating in more than two states or Union Territories.

9.6 Self-Compliance:

- (a) Every Institutional waste generator organized and un-organized retailer, recycler and operator of plastic treatment plants shall maintain a self-compliance register, which shall be mandatory evidence for proof of compliance with these Bye-laws.
- (b) Such self-compliance register shall be maintained in the format prescribed by the Local Body in Annexure - 2 - Form - 2 and shall be filled with such periodicity as to correspond to the frequency of the disposal of plastic wastes, by the maintaining entity.
- (c) Persons failing to maintain the self-compliance register shall be subjected to the penalty stipulated under Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018.

10. User, Registration Charges:

- (a) All the organized wholesaler, retailers, un-organized retailers, and street vendors shall pay registration charges at rate 10% of their trading license registration fee and renewal charges at rate 5% of their trading license renewal fee.
- (b) All institutional waste generators shall pay user charges/fees as may be specified by the Local Body for Solid Waste Management from time to time.
- (c) The Local Body shall provide for the registration and renewal of organized wholesaler, retailers, un-organized retailers and street vendors, desirous of providing plastic carry bags to their consumers.

11. Prohibition of certain plastic items:

- (a) No person shall carry, use or store any plastic carry bags below the permissible minimum thickness (as prescribed from time to time) and size or any plastic articles having single use such as disposable plastic bottles, cups, glasses, plates, spoons, forks etc. within premises owned, managed or controlled by the Local Body or any Department of the Urban Local Bodies.
- (b) The prohibition under clause (a) above shall not affect the use of plastic carry bags as specified under the Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016.
- (c) Any such plastic carry bags or plastic articles shall be confiscated at the point of entry or in any other manner authorized by the Local Body. The Local Body shall seek to provide, for payment or otherwise, alternative bags (non-plastic) at such places.
- (d) Any person in breach of such prohibition shall be liable to charges prescribed under the Bye-laws and any other laws in force at the time being. A notice in this regard shall be provided as per Form - 3 in Annexure - 2.
- (e) The Municipal Commissioner/Chief Municipal Executive Officer/ Deputy Commissioner may, by notification.
 - (i) Extend such prohibition to any other place or premises, whether private or public, including premises owned, managed or controlled by Departments of the Central or State Governments within the jurisdiction of the Municipal Corporation/ Municipalities/DUDA's as may be specified in such notification;
 - (ii) Direct minimum standards of non-plastic carry bags, such as a minimum recycled content for paper bags provided by shopkeepers, vendors, wholesalers, retailers, hawkers etc.

12. The Local Body shall-

- (a) encourage the minimization of plastic use within its jurisdictional limits by generating awareness on the problems presented by excessive plastic use, the short term and long term effects of plastic waste on the environment, alternate non-plastic substitutes of plastics etc., on a continuous basis and shall provide budget for the same.
- (b) attempt to integrate the scrap shops within the town, so far as they comply with regulations prescribed by the Municipal Commissioner/ Chief Municipal Executive Officer/ Deputy Commissioner from time to time and register with the Urban Local Body/DUDA's. These units shall be granted registrationfor a period of one year, unless revoked suspended or cancelled, prior to the expiry of one year as per Form 1 of Annexure 2. The registration of such scrap shop recycler will be renewed every year.
- (c) encourage the adoption of suitable processing technologies such as plastic road construction, plyrolysis, incineration, co-processing, brick and tiles etc, to reduce the disposal of plastic wastes into landfills.
- (d) every person/agency engaged in recycling or processing of plastic waste shall prepare and submit an annual report in Form-IV as given in the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018 to the concerned local body under intimation to the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board by the 30th April of every year.
- (e) prepare and submit an annual report in Form -V as given in the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, as amended in 2018 to the State Secretary-in-charge of the UD/Town Planning & Urban Local Bodies and intimate the Arunachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board by the 30th June of every year.
- (f) review and amend the Plastic Waste Management plan once in every 5 years for purposes of ensuring their sustainability, viability, effectiveness and relevance in relation to regulatory and technological developments.

ANNEXURE - 1

SCHEDULE OF FINES AND PENALTIES AND COMPOUNDING CHARGES

Offenses under Bye-laws:As per provision contained under Section131,134 and sub section (1) and (2) of Section 229 of the Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 2007 (Act No. 4 of 2018) and Section 399 of Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 2019 (Act, No.8 of 2019), certain offences are punishable with fines whoever:

- contravene provision of any of the rules, sub-rules and clauses mentioned in the first column of the following table or any regulation made there under; or
- (2) fails to comply with any requisition lawfully made upon him under any of the said rules, sub-rules or clauses, shall be punished, for each such offense, with fine which may extend to the amount mentioned in that behalf in the fourth column of the table as below;
- (3) in case of further contravention, the Local Body shall have power to cancel trade license, recover the penalty amounts as per the different modes set out in Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 2007/ Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 2019 and/or take any other appropriate action as per the other relevant act and rules.
